Young Innovators Shine at TechnoXian East Zone Championship

Bringing laurels to the school, Grade 7 students Abhigya Kashyap, Parth Jain, and Chaitanya Siotia secured First Place in the Innovation Challenge at the TechnoXian East Zone Championship, held at Dr. Sudhir Chandra Sur Institute, Kolkata, on 25–26 July 2026.

Their award-winning project, Rain-Recharge Radar, leverages open satellite data to identify locations across Guwahati where monsoon rainfall can be effectively recharged into the ground instead of being lost as flood runoff. Using Google Earth Engine, the team mapped and analysed all 60 municipal wards of the city, covering 172.5 km². Integrating Sentinel-1, Sentinel-2, Landsat 9, and SRTM datasets, the project has been developed as a live public web application that demonstrates the potential of geospatial technology in promoting flood resilience and sustainable groundwater management.

Under the dedicated mentorship of Mr. Nabojyoti Gupta, STEM In-charge, the team will now represent the region at the TechnoXian National Finals in New Delhi this November. Their remarkable achievement reflects the spirit of innovation, perseverance, and collaborative learning that defines our school community. We wish our young innovators and their mentor every success in the national round.
