AISSCE 2026: A Year of Academic Excellence

Royal Global School proudly celebrates the outstanding performance of its students in the All India Senior School Certificate Examination (AISSCE) 2026. The results reflect the dedication, perseverance, and academic commitment of our students, supported by the relentless efforts of teachers and parents.

The school recorded an impressive overall average of 84.07%, reaffirming its tradition of academic excellence. Among the three streams, Humanities emerged as the highest-performing stream with an average of 88.06%, followed by Commerce with 83.25% and Science with 81.44%.

A remarkable feature of this year's results was the large number of high achievers. Nearly one-third of the students secured scores above 90%, showcasing the school's strong academic foundation and culture of excellence.

Teesta Bora emerged as the Science topper with an outstanding 96.2%, followed by Shaurya D. Khemka with 94.0% and Paraj Garg with 93.4%.

The Commerce stream was led by Tripti Agarwal, who secured an excellent 96.0%. She was closely followed by Aarav Goel with 95.6% and Darrsh More with 95.2%.

The Humanities stream delivered exceptional results, with Zaveri Tahsin emerging as the school topper with a phenomenal 98.6%. Ananya Borkotoky and Navyaa Oja shared the second position with 97.0%, while Devangi Jalan and Reeha Bhuyan secured the third position with 96.6%. The Humanities stream recorded the highest concentration of top scorers, with nearly half of its students securing above 90%. Commerce also demonstrated consistent excellence, while the Science stream registered a strong performance with all students scoring above 60%.

The AISSCE 2026 results were further distinguished by several exceptional individual achievements across subjects. Devangi Jalan secured a perfect score of 100 in Entrepreneurship, while Zaveri Tahsin achieved 100 in Political Science. In Psychology, Ananya Borkotoky, Khushi Ghising, Navyaa Oja, Pratistha D. Hazarika, and Sayantana Saikia earned perfect scores of 100, reflecting outstanding academic excellence. The school also witnessed an impressive number of centums in Painting, with multiple students attaining full marks. 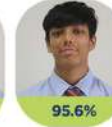

“Bharat- Contours of Continuity”

On 15th May 2026, the students of the History Department of Classes 11 and 12 visited to the specially curated exhibition “Bharat: Contours of Continuity” hosted at The Assam Royal Global University in collaboration with the Indian Museum, Kolkata, on the occasion of International Museum Day and 150 Years of Vande Mataram.

The visit was highly informative and gave us an opportunity to observe various sculptures, paintings, and historical artefacts related to Indian art and culture.

As we entered the museum, we were welcomed by a magnificent bronze statue of Nataraja from South India, dating back to the 13th century CE. The sculpture beautifully represented Lord Shiva performing the cosmic dance and immediately captured everyone’s attention.

Moving towards the left section of the museum, we saw a series of Ramayana paintings by the artist Shree Krishnalal. These paintings portrayed important scenes from the epic, such as Rama breaking Haradhanu, Rama with Parashurama, Bharata honouring Rama’s paduka, Rama meeting Hanuman, the death of Ravana, and the coronation of Ramachandra. The artworks were colourful, detailed, and reflected the rich cultural traditions of Bengal and other parts of India.

After exploring the left gallery, we took a right turn and observed several replica sculptures and artefacts from different periods of Indian history. These included sculptures of Buddha, Bodhisattva in meditation, Dharma Chakra, Vishnu, Mahishasuramardini, Parvati, and Gajalakshmi Medallion. We also saw beautiful terracotta and sandstone works, along with sculptures made from schist and bronze. Each artefact reflected the artistic excellence and religious beliefs of ancient and medieval India.

The museum visit was an enriching experience for all of us. It helped us understand Indian history, art, religion, and culture in a more practical and interesting way beyond textbooks. We sincerely thank our teachers and the university authorities for organising this educational trip.

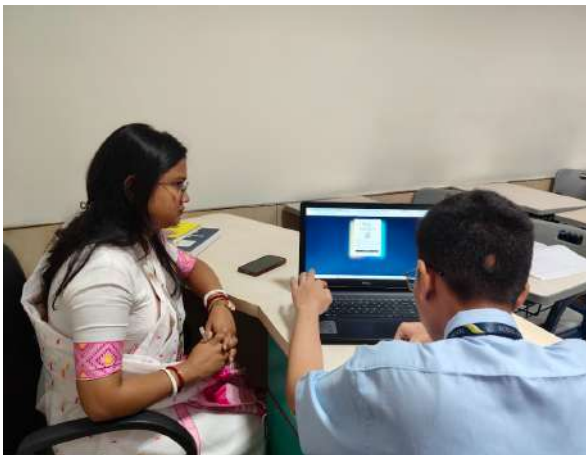

Teachers' Orientation Session for Stem by ThinkTac

1. Introduction

A professional development session for teachers was conducted on 16th May 2026 at our school with the objective of enhancing classroom practices through activity-based learning methodologies. The session was conducted by ThinkTac, a company dedicated to designing innovative learning materials for children, with a strong focus on STEM education and the development of scientific temperament.

2. Purpose of the Session

The session aimed to:

- Reflecting on how such tools could enhance student understanding

- The session fostered collaborative discussion and enthusiasm among the teaching staff.

6. Outcome of the Session

By the end of the session, teachers gained:

Practical exposure to activity-based STEM tools
Clear strategies to implement hands-on learning in science classes
Improved understanding of building scientific temperament through inquiry and exploration

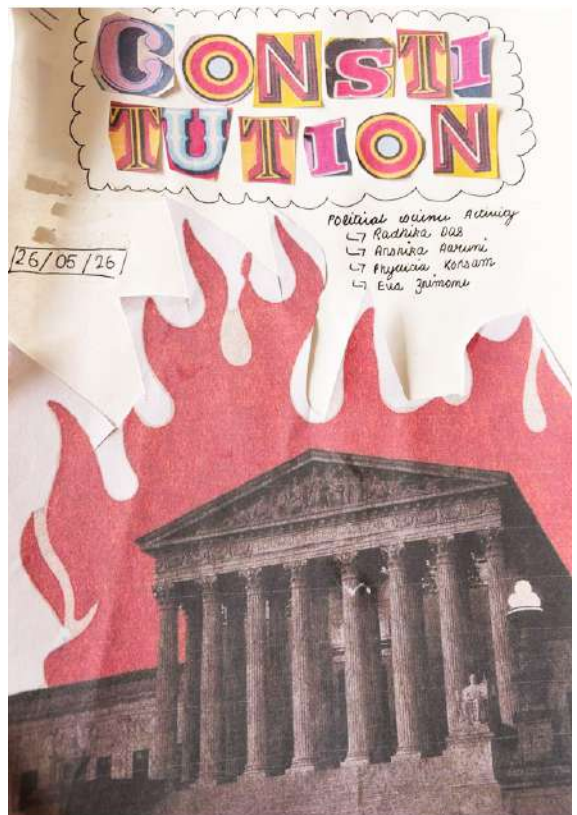
The Making of Our Class Constitution

Overall, it was a highly educational, informative, and memorable field trip that broadened the students' practical knowledge and industry exposure.

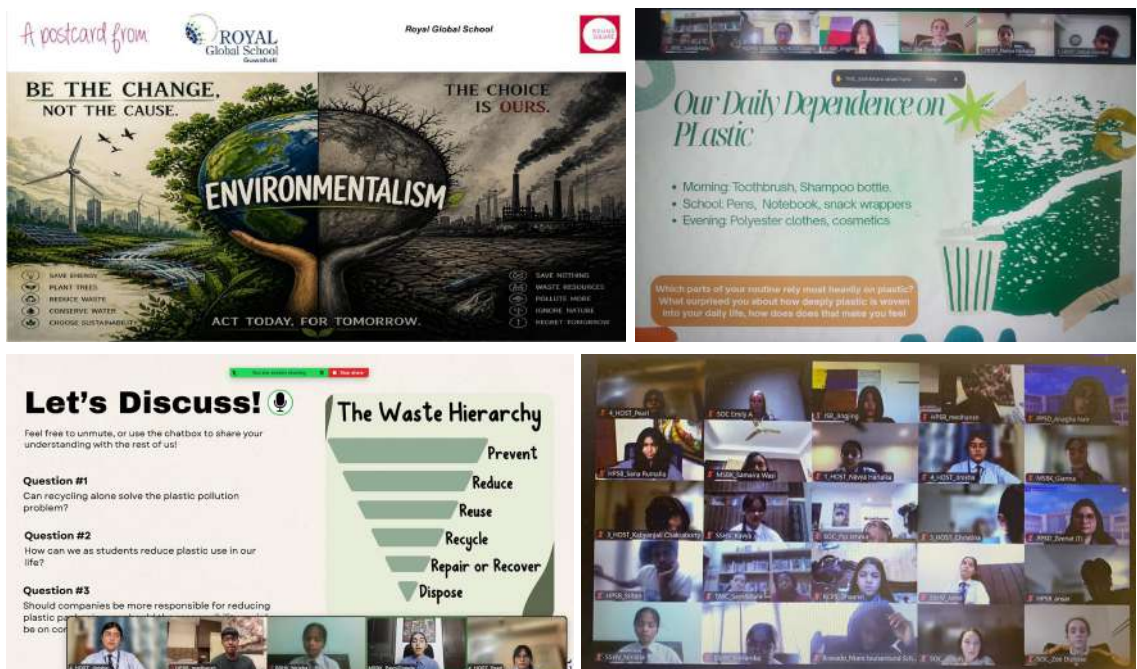




Report on Round Square Postcard Session – “The Plastic Odyssey”

The Royal Debating Society (Vox Populi) witnessed a thrilling culmination of its Intra-Club Debate Tournament 2026–27 on 30 May 2026, as two outstanding teams engaged in an intellectually stimulating contest on the motion: “This House Believes that democracies should ban political parties built around a single individual.”

Representing the Proposition were Arjun Agarwal, Viraj Upadhyay, and Ayaan Khemka, while the Opposition comprised Diya Sarawgi, Dhruv Bagri, and Mihika Das. The finalists demonstrated remarkable research, eloquence, and analytical depth as they navigated the complexities of democratic governance, political accountability, and the role of leadership in modern democracies.

The debate was adjudicated by Ms Adya Mishra, Academic Delivery Lead at Pratarka, ASISC National Debate Champion, and an accomplished international adjudicator with experience across more than 180 debating tournaments worldwide.

The Proposition team argued that personality-centric political parties weaken democratic institutions by concentrating power in the hands of a single individual and fostering a culture of unquestioning loyalty. Through compelling examples and incisive reasoning, they contended that democracies thrive when political movements are rooted in ideas, policies, and collective leadership rather than individual charisma. The Opposition, on the other hand, presented a robust defence of political freedom and democratic choice. They maintained that banning such parties would itself be undemocratic, as voters should retain the right to support any political formation they deem fit. Their arguments highlighted the importance of electoral accountability and the ability of citizens to judge leaders and parties through the democratic process.

The debate was marked by sharp rebuttals, persuasive speeches, and thoughtful engagement with the motion. Both teams displayed exceptional debating skills, making the adjudication process particularly challenging and intellectually rewarding. After careful deliberation, Ms Adya Mishra declared the Proposition team—Arjun Agarwal, Viraj Upadhyay, and Ayaan Khemka—as the winners of the final, commending their coherent case construction, strategic rebuttals, analytical depth, and persuasive delivery.

The event stood as a testament to the spirit of critical inquiry and informed discourse fostered by Vox Populi. It provided participants and audience members alike with an enriching platform to engage with contemporary political issues while celebrating the art of debate, reinforcing the Society's commitment to cultivating thoughtful, informed, and articulate young leaders.
